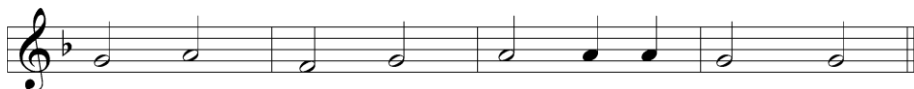

FIRST LESSON – Numbers 21:4-9 – Moses lifts up the bronze serpent to save the people of Israel.
