REMEMBRANCE OF BAPTISM

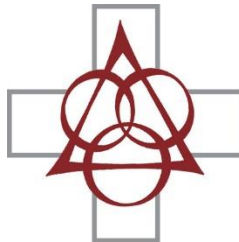
