



REMEMBRANCE OF BAPTISM

- In Holy Baptism Norm was clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all his sin. St. Paul says, "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?"

APOSTLES' CREED


- P God has made us His people through our Baptism into Christ. Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith.

Normand Lee Horn, 91, of Bloomington, Indiana, passed away peacefully on December 5, 2024.

Born on September 8, 1933, to Howard and Myrtle Horn, Normand grew up with a strong sense of duty and adventure that shaped his remarkable life. He served his country proudly in the U.S. Navy from 1951 to 1953 during the Korean War, laying the foundation for his lifelong commitment to service and leadership.

After his military service, Normand dedicated his career to education, touching countless lives as a teacher at Elm Heights Elementary and as principal at Marlin Elementary, Brown Elementary, and Lakeview Elementary, where a nature trail was named in his honor. He was an active and respected member of various educational and philanthropic organizations in the State of Indiana, leaving behind a legacy of compassion, mentorship, and community impact.

Normand embraced life with a deep appreciation for the outdoors, enjoying hunting, fishing, snow skiing, and traveling. His adventurous spirit took him to all 50 states, as well as numerous countries across Europe and Asia.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 65 years, Shelvy Horn; his daughter, Leah Ballou; son-in-law, David Ballou; and granddaughters, Mallory and Aubrey Ballou. He also leaves behind his sisters, Carole Hans (Kenny) and Sharon Fisher, along with many cherished nieces and nephews.

Normand was preceded in death by his parents, Howard and Myrtle Horn; his brother, Leonard Horn (Jean); mother and father-in-law, Elmer and Viola Parsons, and his brother and sister-in-law, Paul and Marilyn Parsons.

Normand will be deeply missed by all who knew him, but his legacy of love, service, and adventure will endure in the hearts of his family and the countless lives he touched.
